

Simple, cost-effective plan

- Goals keep it simple
 - Start a Latino Outreach Program to promote library services to Spanish speakers.
- Activities use interns special skills
 - Hire a friendly, intelligent, flexible, bilingual college student to work with the librarian
 - Create a list of possible outreach activities:
 - Story times
 - Information fairs
 - Language exchange

- Web videos
- Computer class
- Develop new program with migrant center

Simple, cost-effective plan continued...

- Budget you must pay!
 - ▶ Wage = \$2,300
 - ▶ \$12 per hour (above minimum wage; equal to a page)
 - ► Include 14% benefits (workers comp, etc.)
 - ▶ 6 hours per week; 27 weeks; April 15th through October 15th
 - Training
 - ▶ 1 day workshop on early literacy for caregivers, storytellers, etc.
 - ▶ Observe story time, language program, etc. at another library
 - Shadow library staff
 - Promotional materials
 - Special fun bilingual books for story time
 - ► Give aways (bilingual bookmarks, pens, stickers, tattoos, in-kind)
