What I'm Reading: Fine Motor Skills

Each month this year I've been writing some early literacy support materials for our storytime staff, to provide background information about how the five practices of reading, writing, singing, talking, and playing support the development of early literacy skills. By far the practice that I knew the least about was writing. It has been a lot of fun to build up my knowledge about fine motor skills and age-appropriate pre-writing activities. One of the things I wanted to pass along to staff was the reminder that using fingerplays in storytime could be one way of building fine motor skills. So I did some quick Googling, confident I would find a concise article making that connection. But this was harder to

Video Recording Best Practices


(Remember: the focus should be on your actions & your voice)


Use a tripod or some kind of camera support






