OLPP's premise



Library service ought to mirror the way Oregonians live, work, shop, and play.



Oregon libraries already share



Metropolitan Interlibrary eXchange (MIX)

 Clackamas, Hood River, Multnomah and Washington counties, Fort Vancouver Regional Library System, and Camas Public Library have had cooperative library cards since the 1980s













ORBIS Cascade Alliance



37 academic libraries in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho

Sage Library System



70+ libraries in 15 counties across eastern and central Oregon.



How it works

Library cardholders from a participating library may use other participating libraries; a library extends service to users of other participating libraries, and vice versa.








What libraries are eligible?



- Legally-established public libraries
- Private and public academic libraries
- **Community college libraries**
- Special libraries that are open to the public








Washington County has a patron who likes to golf.








She likes to golf in Bandon, on the south coast.







Fortunately, WCCLS and the Bandon Public Library both belong to the OLPP.








The patron signs up for a card at Bandon, just like any other new patron ...

... including verifying her ID, mailing address, or whatever other local requirements you have.









The patron gets a card at the Bandon Public Library and can use it while she golfs there!

Oh, and a Bandon patron could get a card in Washington County, too.





Benefits to libraries



- **Expanded access to materials for your patrons**
- Increased usage of your materials
- Increased value of a patron having a library card
- Participation at your comfort level
- Goodwill with patrons and colleagues
- **Voluntary**
- Free



Expectations of libraries



Issue cards to patrons of OLPP participating libraries free of charge

Provide access to materials as determined by local policy

Establish a unique patron code for OLPP patrons

Report statistics and provide feedback as requested

Join and participate in an email discussion list



Types of statistics we request



- **Total number of OLPP patrons**
- **Circulation by OLPP patrons**
- **Home libraries of OLPP patrons**
- # of OLPP cards renewed
- # of items lost by OLPP patrons



Benefits for patrons



Free

Access to libraries across the state

Access to libraries that are by where you work, live, shop, or play

For unserved patrons, ability to purchase a library card at a participating library



Expectations of patrons




- Obtain a home library card
- Comply with registration, circulation, and other policies of each participating library
- Pick up and return all borrowed materials to the participating library
- Be responsible for any fines and fees from the participating library
- Notify the participating library of changes in contact information



Allow access at your comfort level





Use patron permission groups to set restrictions for OLPP patrons.



Allow access at your comfort level



OLPP patrons may have restrictions that patrons from your local jurisdiction don't

- Lower item limits
- No database access
- No out-of-system interlibrary loans





How to sign up

Get approval from the appropriate official or governing body for your library and complete the OLP Program Participating Library Agreement.






Concern about staff workload



They're envisioning this ...



but response has been more like this ...



Library staff is overworked as is

- The process is only as complex as you make it.
- If it really becomes overwhelming, your library can pull out





Lost materials or bare shelves

- Deadbeatery seems to be evenly distributed among libraries
- You can pursue Passport patrons through your normal lost item process
- You may limit use by Passport patrons to limit liability





We're a HAVE library, but our neighbor is a HAVE NOT

- You'd be surprised where your patrons will go or what access they think is valuable!
- Passport allows you to offer statewide access to materials there
 is always a benefit, even for large libraries.





You won't be able to convince your council/board

 What to tell your policymakers: for no additional cost, you can expand access statewide for your patrons, including public and academic libraries!





You'll jeopardize your electronic resource licenses

Prevent Passport patrons from accessing your online databases





We're waiting to see how it goes for other libraries

• The more libraries that participate, the better it will be for **all** libraries. A rising tide floats all boats, the more the merrier, don't be a wallflower, and get off the sidelines and become part of the fun. Your patrons win only if you participate!


