#### Open Education Resources

Open educational resources (OER) means teaching, learning, and research resources that reside in the public domain or have been released under an intellectual property license that permits their free use and repurposing by others.

OERs include full courses, course materials, modules, textbooks, streaming videos, tests, software, and any other tools, materials, or techniques used to support access to knowledge.


The key distinction about open resources is their use of an alternative to copyright called a Creative Commons copyright license.







# Covering the Cost: a Student PIRGs report, February 2016

- Textbook prices disproportionately impact community college students: 50% of students report using financial aid for books at community colleges, compared to 28% at 4 year public schools. And, on average, community college students use more financial aid than their peers at 4 year schools.
- 5.2 million U.S. undergraduate students spend a total of \$1.5 billion dollars of financial aid on textbooks every semester, or \$3 billion per year.



Only 51 out of 100 FTEs are still enrolled after one year






