Benefits of partnering

- Visibility/marketing
- Building expertise and competencies
- Securing costs and resources

Difficulties of partnering

- Insufficient resources/funding
- Tangential to mission
- Logistical difficulties
- Contention among partners

Partnerships

Pros and cons of partnering

Before the partnership

- Analyze costs & benefits
- Establish goals
- Does it fit your mission?
- Budget more time and \$ than you predict
- Look at how your organizational cultures differ

- Evaluate on-the-fly
- Constantly check in with each other
- Look for ways to improve the programs as you're engaged in them
- Make sure that everything relates to the goals you established

- Evaluate any programs and services that occured
- Assess the partnership itself: did it achieve the goals you set out?
- Plan for future partnership efforts, if deemed valuable





