ISSUES (Coos Bay):

- Large Digital Divide
- Difficulty obtaining and retaining qualified volunteers

SOLUTION:

- AmeriCorps Volunteer



HOW to Get a Member

- **Apply for project:** turn in prior to technical assistance deadline to get feedback and make application competitive
- **Rolling Interviews:** once accepted by AmeriCorps, post job and start interviewing as the apps come in!
- **Library's contribution (cash match) to AmeriCorps:**
 - Level 1 (1st year): \$6,825.00
 - Level 2 (after 1st year): \$7,350.00

Sites Provide:

- **Cash Match per Member Service Year**
- **Project training, ongoing professional development, and mentorship for the member**
- **Project related travel reimbursement for the member**
- **Funding for supplies and materials necessary for the project**
- **Office space complete with desk, computer, printer, phone, internet, email, and access to a copy machine and fax machine**
- **Developing local member recruitment strategies**



Member Benefits

- **Stipend:** taxable, monthly allowance (before taxes, approximately \$1,139)
- **Education Benefit:** \$5,645 awarded upon completion of service, can be used to repay qualified student loans or for further education
- **Plus:** loan forbearance, basic medical insurance, child care, etc.
