Do not mistake it for a caramel or one of those funny little German Christmas cakes - or any other confection. I quote from Edgar J. Banks - Alpine New Jersey from whom I purchased it 'A typical tablet of about the average size of the Ur dynasty - very distinct writing - a receipt for oil and other products. Dated on back about 2350 B.C.' Evidently the way to make clay immortal is to burn it - Hence churches - C.E.S. Wood."
