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# Why does this matter?



+9%

Workers who **use digital applications**, such as e-mail, **frequently** in their jobs **earn 9% more** per hour, on average, than workers who are equally proficient in literacy, numeracy and problem solving, have attained similar levels of education and work in similar jobs, but who rarely use them.

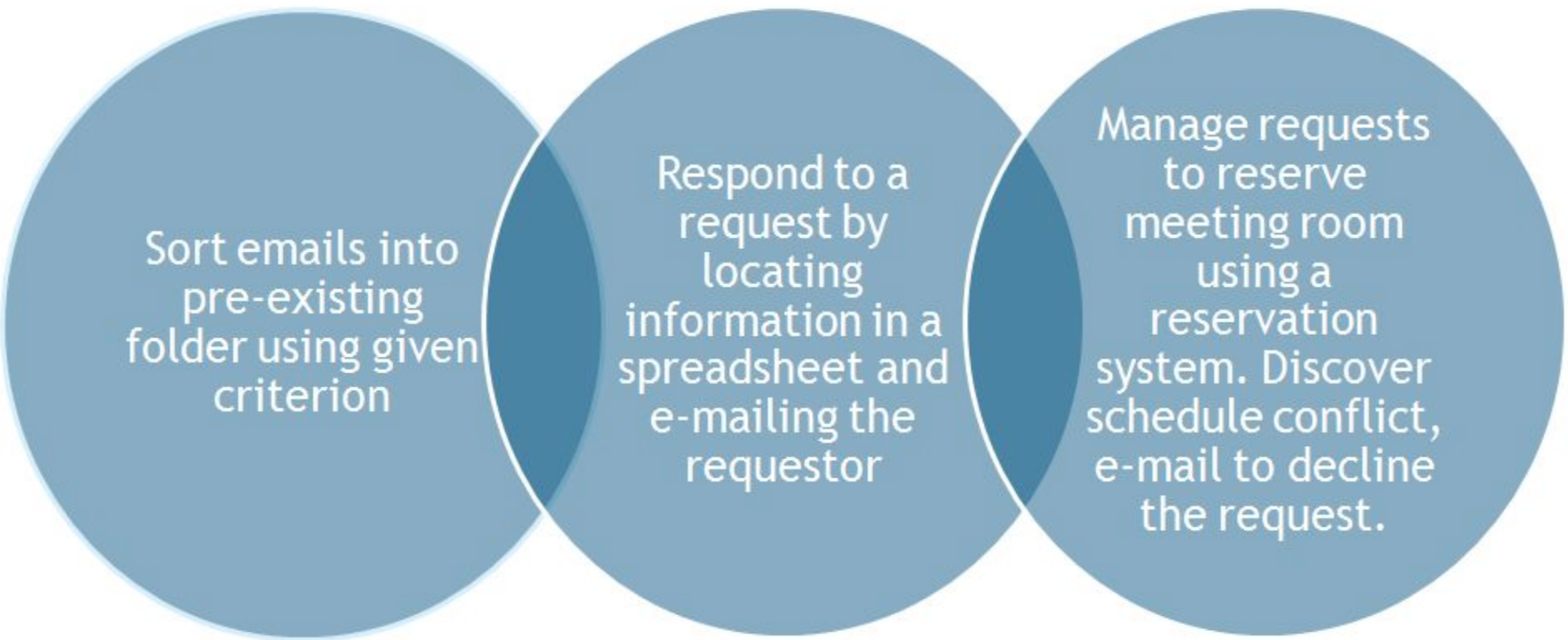

# What does the assessment tell us?



Sort emails into pre-existing folder using given criterion

Respond to a request by locating information in a spreadsheet and e-mailing the requestor

Manage requests to reserve meeting room using a reservation system. Discover schedule conflict, e-mail to decline the request.

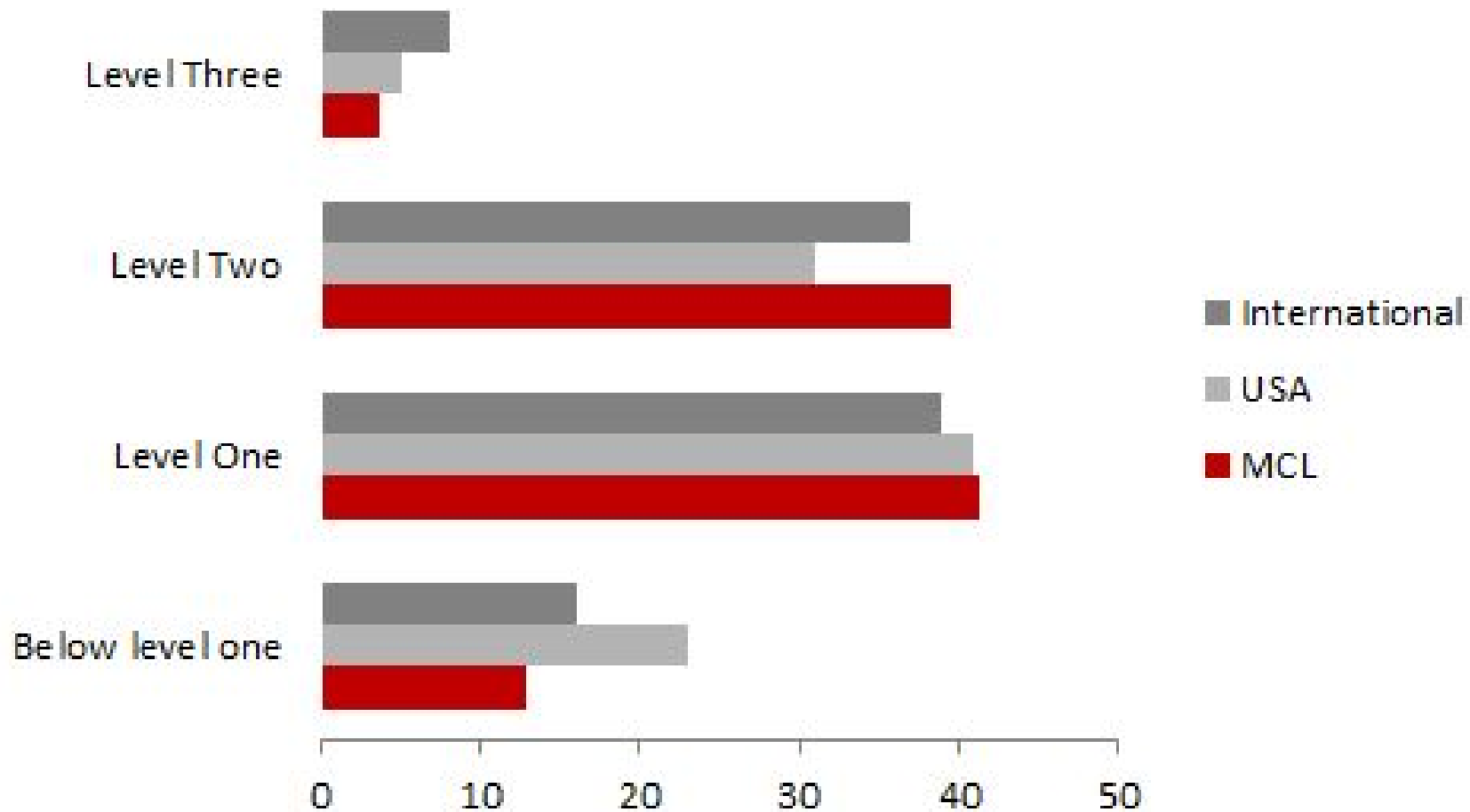

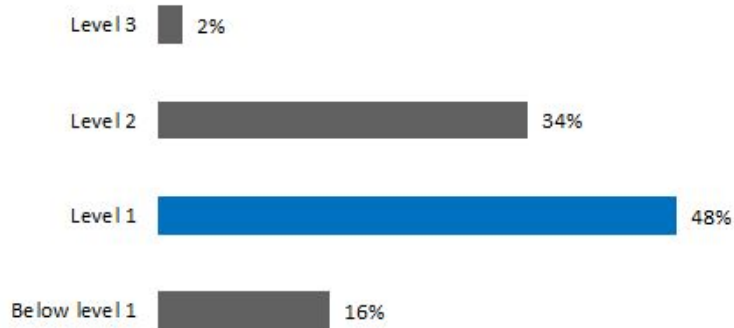




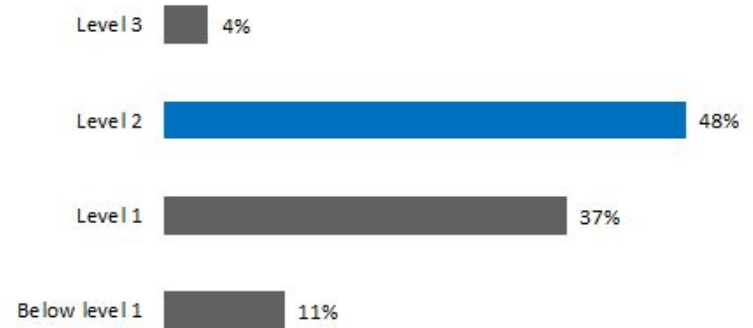


# Access internet mostly with mobile device?

Yes (N=88)

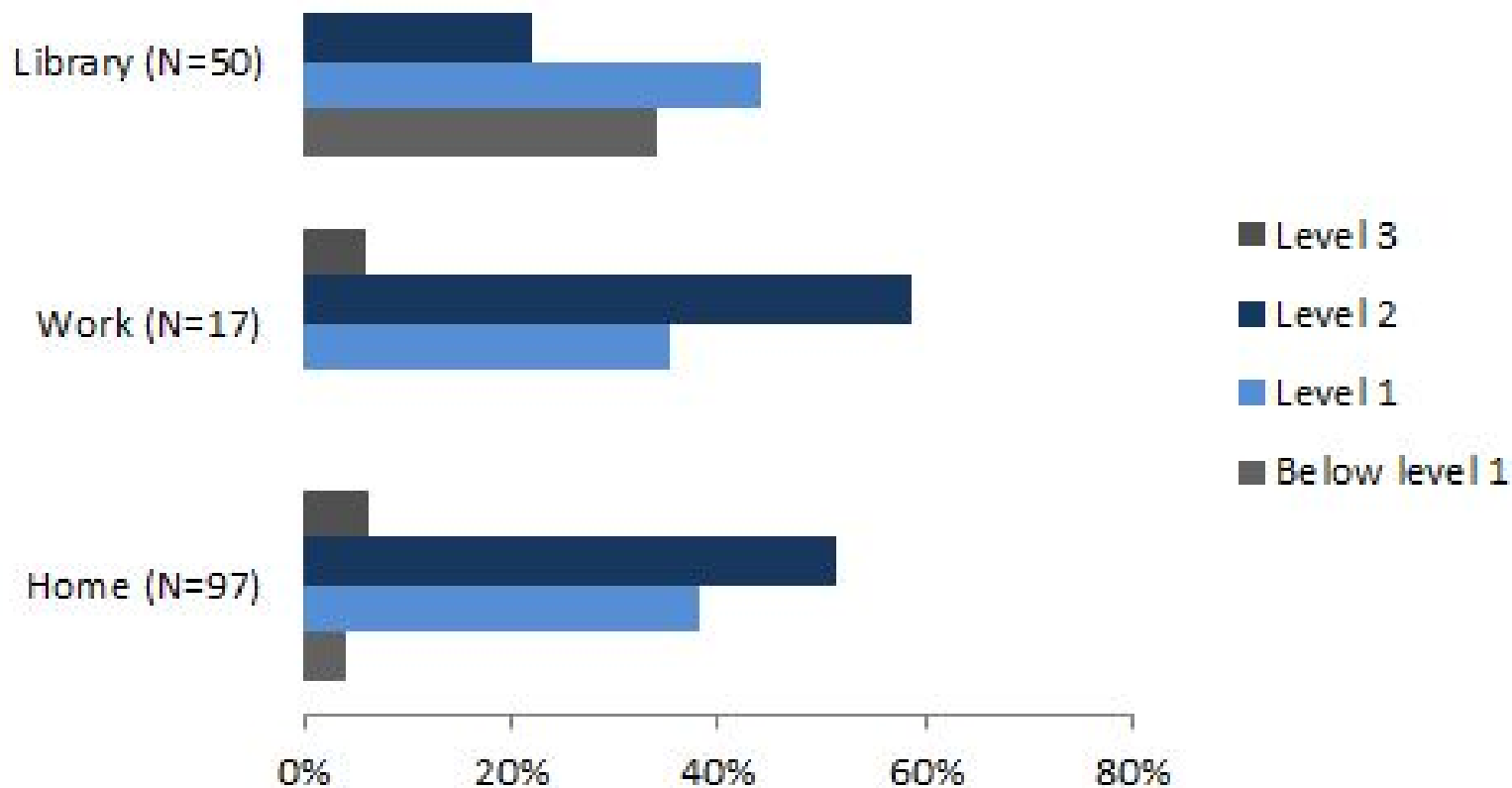


No (N=90)

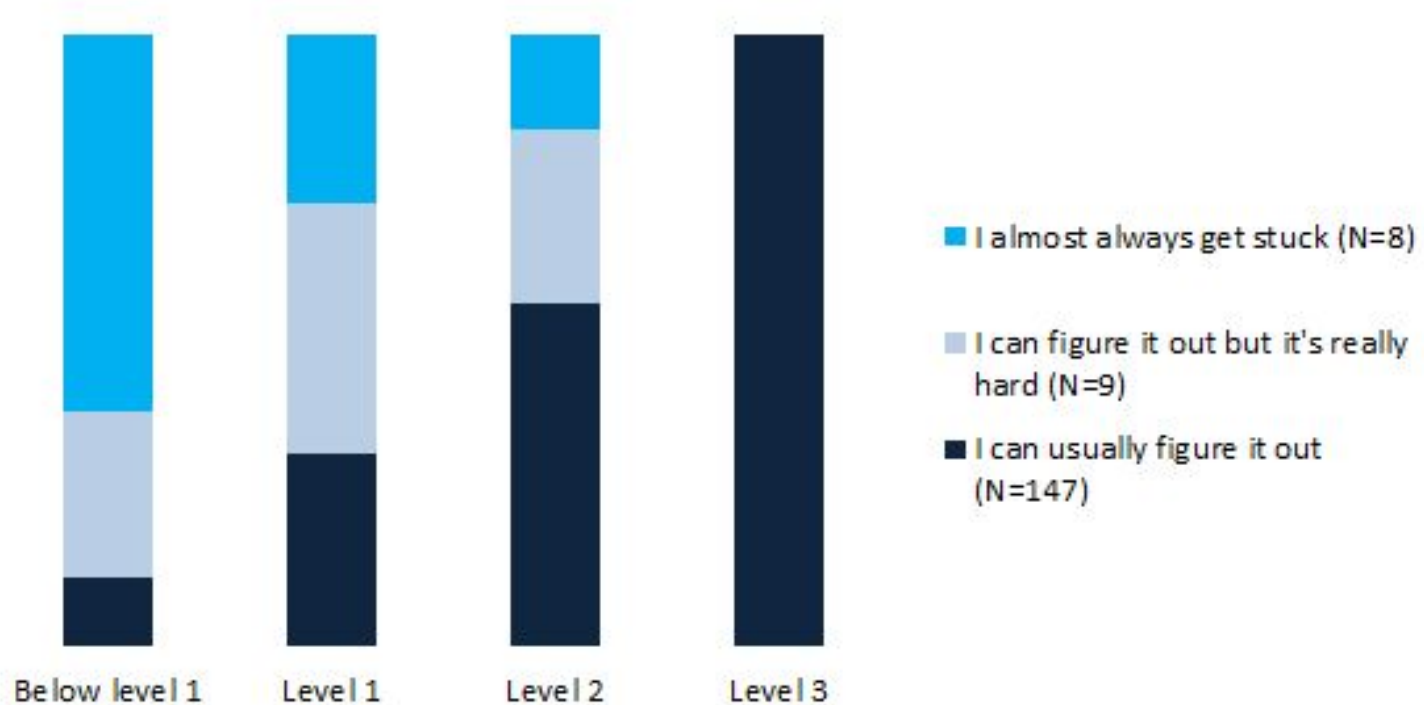




## Where do you access the internet most often?



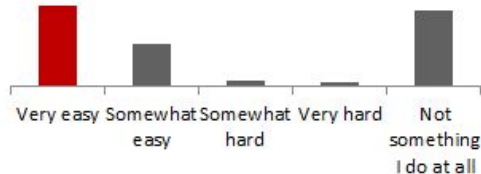

<b>Levels of Independence</b>	<b>Independent / Straight-forward:</b> Participant immediately navigates to the correct areas on the screen and takes action without any prompting	<b>Independent / Prolonged:</b> Participant hesitates or finds completing the task confusing, but eventually takes action without direct intervention from the interviewer or learning partner. Participant may have questions about the appearance of the screen but not questions about actions that need to be taken.	<b>Partial Independence:</b> After being directed to the correct areas of the screen by the interviewer or learning partner, the participant is able to complete the different steps within the task on their own.	<b>Aided / Prolonged:</b> Participant requires interviewer's or learning partner's direct intervention / guidance after trying on their own to find the correct areas or steps within the task or repeatedly selects the wrong areas or steps within the task.	<b>Gives up:</b> The participant either looks at the task or step within the task for a moment and states they don't know what to do or immediately states they can't do it.
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### Observable skills:

- Goal setting and progress monitoring
- Planning, self organizing
- Acquiring and evaluating information
- Making use of information
- Domain knowledge

I'm going to go step-by-step to figure this out. I'll need help if I run into something I haven't seen before.

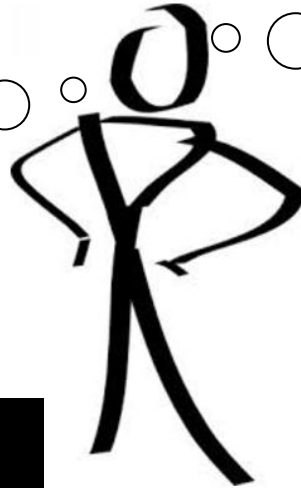
### **The Procedural Mindset**

## Resize

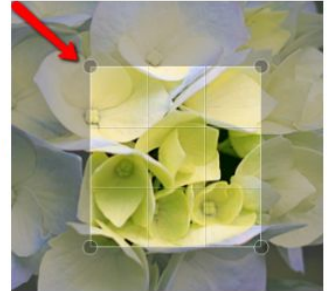
1. Click **Resize**
2. Either enter the pixel size you want to use, or check the **Use percentages** box to shrink or enlarge your photo.
3. Check the **Keep proportions** box to avoid stretching your photo.

Be sure to click  when you're done.

## Crop

1. Click **Crop**
2. Choose an option from the drop-down menu. **No fixed proportions** will allow you to change the shape of the photo. Other options will let you easily make the shape what you want.
3. Change the size of the photo here, or crop it first and then **resize**.
4. Drag the grid for more control.
