Description

This workshop will provide opportunities to explore different virtual reference models, with a view towards how Answerland coordinates different types of libraries to support Oregon’s diverse populations. We’ll role-play scenarios for statewide virtual reference services, using the experiences to complete SWOT analyses and consider potential future paths for Answerland. Through this session, the Answerland Advisory Committee invites librarians to share their experiences from their home libraries, learn about others’ experiences, and consider how virtual reference tools and services can be used to support diverse populations.
