It is refreshing to see how others pursue shared activities, goals or interests in other settings.






Visits to PNW Libraries December 2018 July 13, 2019





Pace ourselves like beginners

Remember that we are beginners when taking on new roles, engaging new audiences or expanding to offer new services.

When tired, overwhelmed or frustrated, how can taking another's perspective make challenges more tractable?

Example: I tried to view the health information needs of OHSU's general public patrons from the public library perspective instead of our academic library point of view.

Give ourselves multiple opportunities for exposure to sink in.
