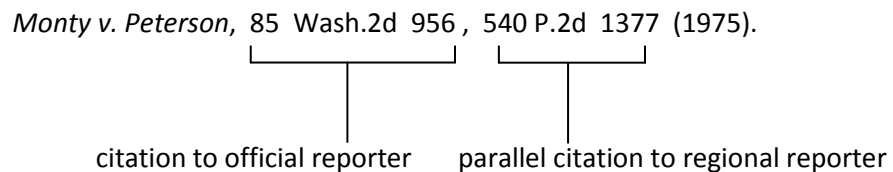
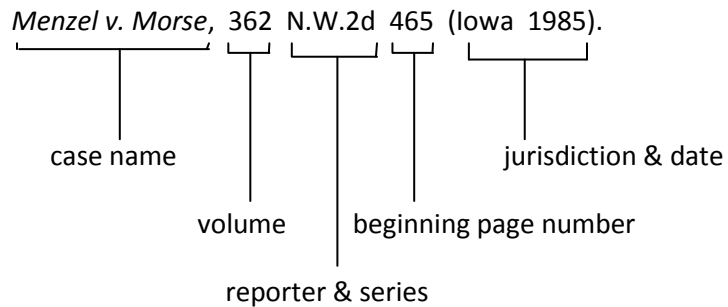

- Case name
- Volume
- Abbreviation for the reporter and series designation
- Beginning page number of the opinion
- Jurisdiction and court
- Date

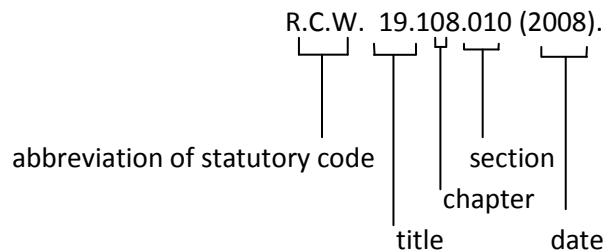
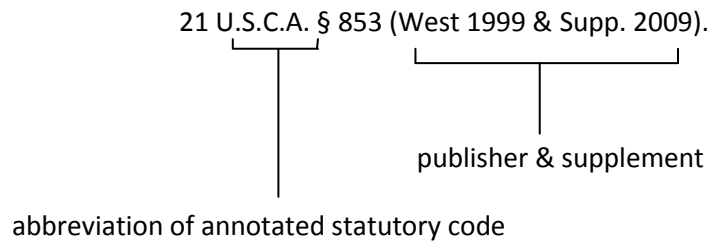
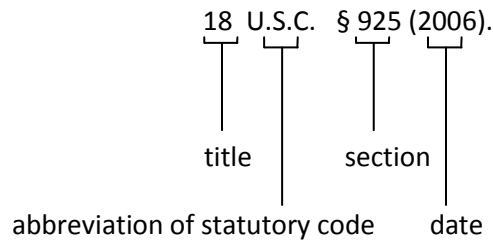
These elements are labeled in the examples below:



There are several elements to a basic statutory code citation. Each state has its own statutory code and formats differ, consult Table T.1 of the Bluebook for each state.

- Title or chapter
- Abbreviation of the statutory code
- Section
- Publisher (if unofficial)
- Date

There are several elements to a legal periodical citation. Consult Table T.13 of the Bluebook for abbreviations to legal periodicals.

- Author
- Title of the article
- Volume
- Abbreviation to legal periodical
- Beginning page number of the article
- Date
