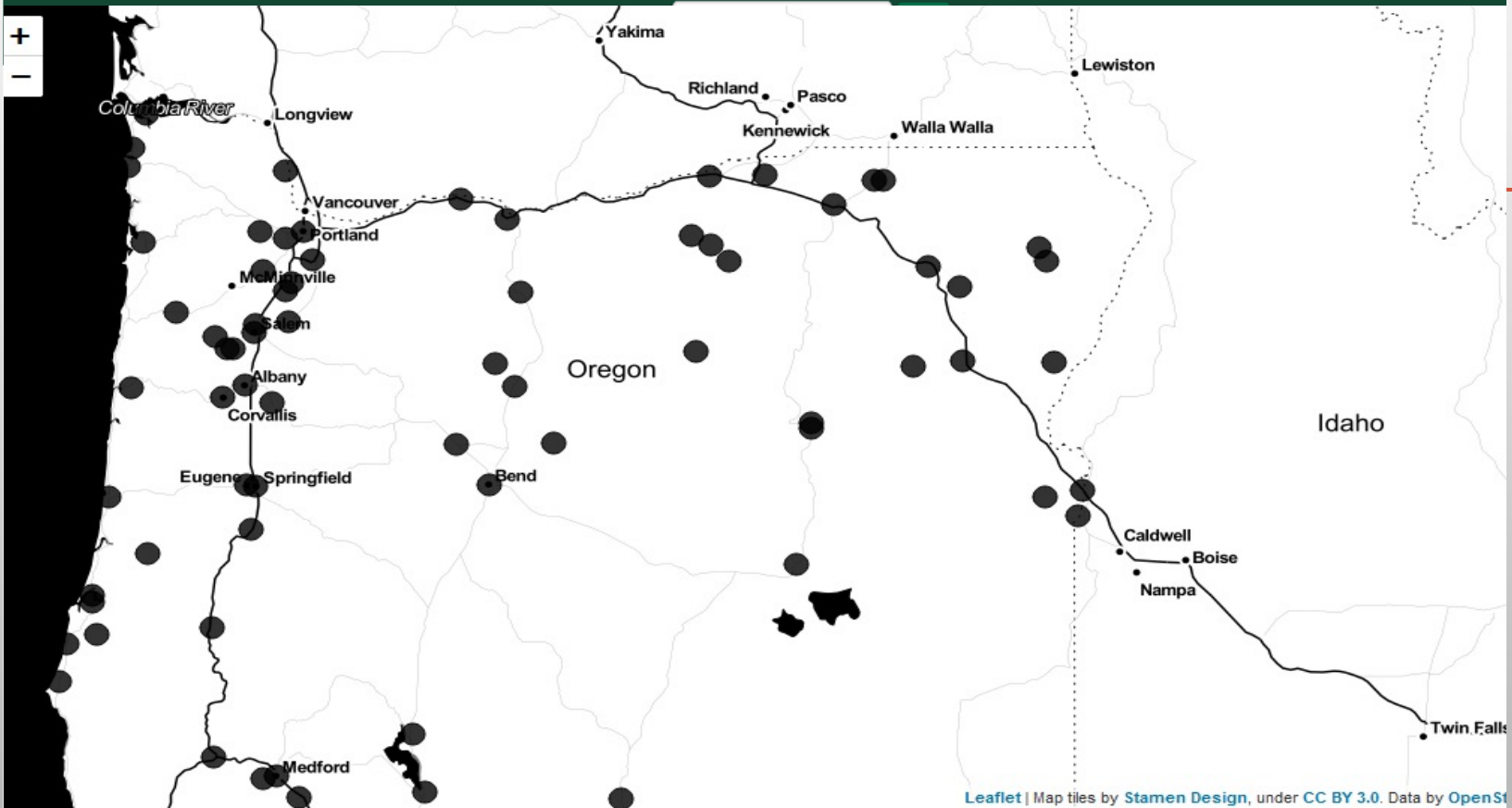

- Phase I: Current tribal newspapers published to tribal websites
- Phase II: Microfilm back files for current tribal newspapers published to tribal websites
- Phase III: Paper back files for current tribal newspapers published to tribal websites
- Phase IV: Chemawa Indian Training School serials



Building Relationships

- Early recognition of potential for project

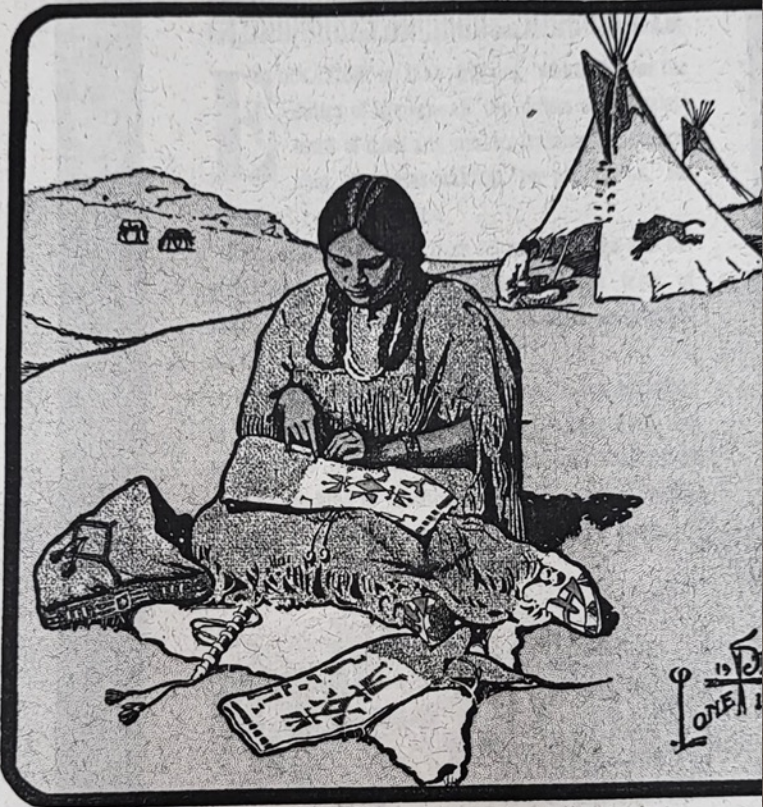

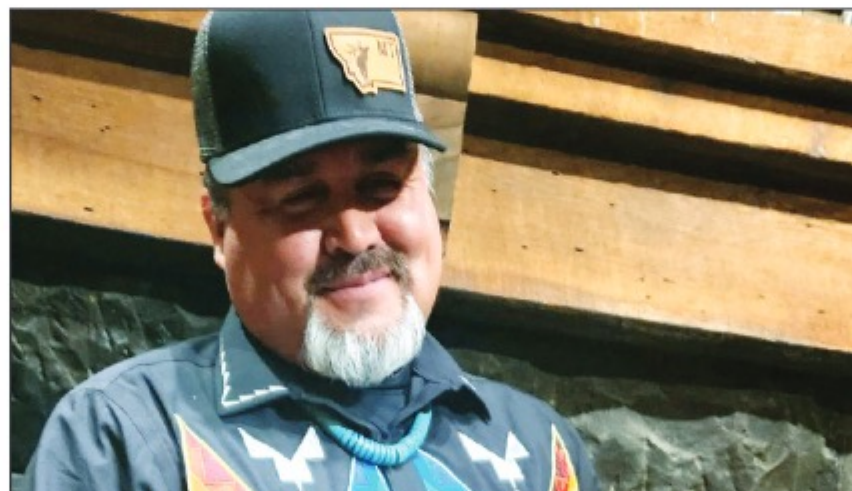
