





## FORMAT, NOT GENRE

A graphic novel is a format, not a genre. It refers to a long-form work of sequential art, often with complex narratives and developed characters. The term "graphic novel" is used to describe any book in a comic format that resembles a novel in length and narrative development...Unlike comic books, which are usually part of serialized narratives, graphic novels contain complete narratives, whether or not they are part of a larger series.






















In an editorial, the New York Times proclaimed that comic books (and graphic novels, of course) had an essential place in education. Why? They stated, "The pairing of visual and written plotlines that [comic books] rely on appear to be especially helpful to struggling readers."

This melding of visuals with words is perhaps the most obvious reason students read comics and graphic novels in the first place. And, studies have shown, that struggling readers greatly benefit from reader supports, such as pictures or illustrations that directly reflect the text.

In her book, Graphic Novels in Your Media Center, media specialist Allyson A. W. Lyga agrees, stating, "[Struggling readers] can focus their mental energy on gaining meaning from pictures (and, thus, understanding the story) rather than becoming frustrated by text that constantly challenges their inability to create mental pictures of the story." Visual supports are especially helpful for younger readers. For this reason, publishers are bringing the format to an even younger audience: early readers, ages four to eight. (from Capstone)














### ORGANIZATION CAN IMPROVE CIRCULATION
